



2023 Roundhouse Aquarium Summer Science Beach Camp Safety Guidelines and Camp Details

Activities may include: digging for sand crabs, playing in the waves, dissecting squid, learning about sharks, looking at plankton using a microscope, building sand sculptures, soda geyser explosions, making crafts, building a boat, doing experiments, touching live animals, playing beach games, and more!

2023 Guidelines:

- Small group size (approximately 12 campers and 4 counselors) that stays together all week
- Masks optional
- Drop-off and pick-up windows (we are hoping to alleviate traffic congestion by spreading out the drop-off and pick-up windows):
 - **Drop-off 8:50am-9:10am**
 - **Pick-up 11:50am-12:10pm**
- Campers must **bring their own water and snack** each day- keep an eye out for allergy alerts on what NOT to pack
- Campers must be able **to carry their own backpack/bag with supplies**
- Increased sanitization, hand washing, and hand sanitizer use
- Campers **MUST** be able to use the restroom on their own
- Campers **MUST** stay with their assigned group
- If your camper or someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19, do **NOT** bring them to camp and please alert the Roundhouse staff immediately (email or call)

*1 t-shirt included. Camp t-shirts are *highly* recommended each day (extra camp shirts can be purchased for \$15 each).

Important Information:

- No refunds or credit without 3 business day notice for cancellation of any class:
- 15% charge for all other cancellations
- \$20 charge for all class scheduling changes
- There is a \$15 charge per child for each 10 minutes a guardian is late for pick up
- CPR/First aid certified staff present at all camps
- All water activities done in front of LA county lifeguard tower
- Average 3 campers per counselor, maximum of 4 campers per counselor
- If your camper is harming other campers or is continuously disruptive, they may be required to forfeit the rest of the week and stay home
- If your camper or someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19, do **NOT** bring them to camp and please alert the Roundhouse staff immediately (email or call)
- In the event of sickness: Contact the Roundhouse staff (call or email) as soon as possible to discuss next steps in scheduling changes and/or refunding
